Principal's Report

1. Staffing:

- a. Welcome to University of Lethbridge PSI student teachers **Jared Beler** (3/4O) and **Madison Hetu** (3/4C) who will be with us from November 6 to December 12.
- b. Mr. Vanden Dungen and Mr. Gatner met with the associate superintendent and interim superintendent on Oct. 21 to discuss staffing and enrollment. Our number of students per teacher FTE is lower than they would like to see but our classes are large enough that there is no easy way to solve it by double grading. They would like us to find ways of getting teachers more preps.
- c. Our new superintendent, **Chantel Axani**, officially took on the role Nov. 7. She met with Mr Vanden Dungen on Nov. 7 and plans to return soon and spend more time meeting staff and students.

2. Home and School

3. Assessments / Data

- Early assessment results received and reviewed by the lower elementary collab group. In literacy for gr 1, 54% are requiring additional support, in gr. 2, 25%, and in grade 3, 47%

We will be looking for an opportunity to discuss the results in the next month or so with staff and to share with Council and with the public.

4. School Goals / Improvement Plan

- a. Josh and Dan met with the Director of Learning and the Associate Superintendent to discuss school goals and improvement plan
- b. Supporting struggling students has emerged as the number one concern (particularly in literacy and particularly with EAL students)
- c. Spaces implementation and shift in assessment and reporting practices continues to be a focus as well.
