Principal's Report

- 1. Superintendent Visit on December 11
 - Our new superintendent, Chantal Axani, visited all the classes (junior high were helping to set up for potluck) and she says that she will be coming out again.
 - She was very touched by a special blessing from the grade 6 class,
 - On January 29, she will come out with the entire Senior Admin Team for an hour after school and sit with staff and have open ended conversation.

2. Staffing:

- Farewell to PSI students Madison Hetu and Jared Beler this week and to PSIII interns Cassidy Behm, James Moore, and Carissa De Leeuw next week.
- Welcome to PSIII students Johanna (Jo) Dixon in 34O and Cassidy Haun in 34C starting in January. They will be coming to meet us before Christmas break.
- Our FNMI Facilitator, Anette Bad Eagle, resigned over the past month to resume her studies. The position was posted on November 28.
- 3. Maintenance / Facility:
 - Most of the clocks are now keeping time thanks to the efforts of Mr. Snow. We have put in requests for new ones in the grade 6 room and the music room.
 - A crew was out last week making adjustments to the heating system. We are keeping our fingers crossed that we have finally got things running more smoothly for this winter!

 - Last year we received just under \$6000 for learning disruption funding
 - This year we will receive \$1,572 (to be spent prior to May 1, 2025)

Alberta Assurance Statement:

- We continue to be above the province in all areas of the AEA Survey
- The measure that stands out in this regard is <u>Parental Involvement</u> which used to be well below the province a few years ago but is now well above
- The <u>Access to Supports and Services</u> measure has also seen a significant increase relative to the provincial results in recent years
- We will continue to watch the <u>Welcoming</u>, <u>Caring</u>, <u>Respectful</u>, <u>Safe and Caring Learning Environments</u> measure because junior high was low
- PAT results were more of a mixed bag. The Acceptable measure for Grade 9 was very positive, but the number reaching the Excellence range was lower than expected. Grade 6 Social was lower, but mostly just on Social where EAL students had a harder time. Our students were close to the province on the Acceptable standard on Science and well above on the Excellence standard.

Chair Report

- Pre-K Coffee was November 21st. We had close to 20 moms attend, no dads. They spent the time visiting and visiting the book fair. I think it went very well. Marla was looking into money for us for the remainder of the year from Home and School, as they have extra money (family events budget). Possibly even to buy a Keurig for this purpose. We were thinking \$300 would easily cover the rest of the year. It will likely repeat in the end of January or the beginning of February.
- 4-5 Volleyball is underway! First date had great turnout, lots of parent helpers. Second
 date had only 12 returning kids and myself and the only parent. Four junior high girls
 helped and they did great. I am using an app from volleyball Canada called "Smashball"
 which breaks down volleyball into five levels and provides practice plans! Third and final
 date before Christmas is this Friday. Two more dates in January.
- **ASCE Grant** Screensanity parent night kit. \$250, Book Study parent group? We could purchase books. Other parenting books, in multiple languages...
- Council of Chairs Night. December 2nd.
 - New west side elementary school to be completed by Fall 2026. Will go to tender after the west lethbridge byelection. They are looking at boundary reconfiguration in January.
 - Creating "Parish Community Meetings" 1-3x per year, gathering the parish area Priest, Principals, School Council, Parish Council, possibly trustees, to meet to discuss issues and goals pertaining to our specific parish area and goals like increasing Mass and sacrament participation. ie) we would be paired with St. Joes.
 - Three roundtable discussion items:
 - How to get more engagement in the School Satisfaction surveys that come out in the Spring. Ideas were: short, easy to read infographics sent to parents to look for the survey in the mail and what the survey is for. Use permission click to send in a response that you have completed it (also could track for some kind of incentive). Use a movie night with "survey stations" to help people without internet access.
 - 2. How to use your ASCA grant money... we are not the only ones with this issue of how to spend the \$\$! A lot of schools are starting to purchase "parent library" materials. One school is doing their own "book club" on the Anxious Generation. PD for School Councils. No one has had very much luck spending this... everyone wants to spend it on food!
 - 3. What are we doing in our schools to increase awareness of FNMI and Truth and Reconciliation? Lots of ideas and past events were shared. Many shared that older jr high and high school, staff and possibly parents should go through the blanket exercise. Anything that can incorporate an experience is usually well attended (ribbon skirt making, earring making, story telling, smudges, naming ceremonies, Young Drums Program). Also some were talking about the Learn, Build, Go program for staff... I am unfamiliar with this program.
